


EOM Participation 2022 - Countries of Participants






Mission-by-Mission - All Participants




Gender among Membership

Hungary, Parliamentary Elections

3 April 2022

In a post-election [statement](#) delivered in Budapest, OSCE observers noted that the 3 April parliamentary elections in Hungary offered voters distinct alternatives and were well run, but while competitive, the process was marred by the pervasive overlapping of government and ruling coalition's messaging that blurred the line between state and party, as well as by media bias and opaque campaign funding.

"For voters to be able to make an informed choice, it is fundamental that contestants have equal access to the media and run informative campaigns rather than focus on polarizing messaging and personal attacks, as has unfortunately been observed here," said Kari Henriksen, Special Co-ordinator and leader of the short-term OSCE observer mission. "We also observed that women were underrepresented in the campaign, as well as in political life overall. I would like to encourage political parties to include more women at all levels, and make sure they participate in developing the political decisions that have such an influence on their lives."

"It was good to see that election day was so well managed. However, we also see many flaws in the election process, with numerous prior recommendations to strengthen legislation still unaddressed," Mark Pritchard, Head of the OSCE PA Delegation, said. "I encourage the incoming government to be more ambitious in improving its election legislation, at the very least by allowing citizens to engage in independent election observation. That would do much to improve the trust in the election process."

The transparency and accountability of campaign finance were adversely affected by the lack of disclosure requirements, extensive, unregulated spending through third parties and limited enforcement of the regulatory framework. At the same time, the observation mission noted that widespread government advertisement campaigns paid from the state budget reinforced the main ruling party campaign messages, providing an undue advantage.

The observation mission was a joint undertaking of the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly and the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR), who additionally observed the referendum taking place alongside parliamentary elections.

Serbia, Presidential and Parliamentary Elections

3 April 2022

In a post-election [statement](#) delivered in Belgrade, OSCE observers noted that fundamental freedoms were largely respected in Serbia's 3 April presidential and early parliamentary elections, and voters were presented diverse political options, but a number of shortcomings resulted in an uneven playing field, favouring the incumbent.

The combined impact of unbalanced access to the media, undue pressure on public sector employees to support the incumbents, significant campaign finance disparities and misuse of state resources resulted in unequal conditions for contestants. The legislative changes, adopted shortly before the elections, included some welcome improvements, but key aspects of the electoral process require further reform and implementation, the statement says.

"This was a competitive campaign and, importantly, included opposition candidates this time, but the pervasive influence of the ruling parties gave them undue advantage," said Kyriakos Hadjiyianni, Special Co-ordinator and leader of the OSCE short-term observers.

The elections took place against the backdrop of intense polarization between the ruling coalition and opposition parties, which had been reflected in an opposition boycott of the 2020 parliamentary elections and numerous public protests between July 2020 and January 2022.

"While I wish to emphasize that parties that previously boycotted elections participated this time, after extensive inter-party dialogue that led to a set of reforms, this should be seen as only the starting point for a more transparent dialogue towards broader and much needed further reform," said Bryndis Haraldsdottir, Head of the delegation from the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly. "This approach through dialogue, the core of democracy, has to be the way forward, as part of restoring trust in the system."

The OSCE PA observers worked closely with partners from the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE), the NATO Parliamentary Assembly (NATO PA), and the European Parliament (EP), as well as the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR).

Bosnia and Herzegovina, General Elections

2 October 2022

The 2 October general elections in Bosnia and Herzegovina were competitive and overall well organized with fundamental freedoms respected during the campaign. However, failed reform efforts, a widespread mistrust in public institutions, and ethnically divisive rhetoric continued to mark the election environment, international observers said in a [statement](#) at the post-election press-conference in Sarajevo.


The elections took place against the backdrop of ongoing political deadlock and widespread disillusionment with the political establishment, with some key institutions blocked. The largest parties in power have frequently used ethnically divisive rhetoric as the standard form of debate.

The campaign was calm overall, but observers noted incidents of pressure on public sector employees. The process on election day itself was largely peaceful, although there were some disruptive incidents in and around polling stations.

“Serious efforts to manage this electoral process successfully need to be accompanied by similar efforts to solve the continued political deadlock which keeps undermining real democratic development here,” said Pascal Allizard, Special Co-ordinator and leader of the OSCE short-term observers. “Overall disillusionment towards the political establishment is evident, but I have noticed efforts of a few forward-looking candidates to ignite political and socioeconomic change in the country, which is a positive trend I encourage the newly elected representatives to develop.”

“The capacity to manage an election process appears to have been established relatively well here in Bosnia and Herzegovina,” said Irene Charalambides, Head of the OSCE PA delegation. “But real trust in democratic processes will likely remain elusive until state structures are responsive to the people’s will rather than to entrenched political party interests.”

United States of America, Mid-term Elections 8 November 2022

The OSCE observers [concluded](#) that the 8 November midterm congressional elections were competitive and professionally managed, with active voter participation, but also with threats against election workers and efforts to undermine voters' trust in the electoral process by baselessly questioning its integrity.

Candidates could campaign freely, but many contests were highly polarized and marred by harsh rhetoric, and partisan redistricting resulted in many instances of uncompetitive constituencies. Political campaigns by both major parties were intensely divisive, and the inflammatory rhetoric was accompanied by racist and transphobic tropes invoked by some candidates and prominent commentators. A number of Republican candidates in key races, including those who, if elected as secretaries of state, will have direct responsibility for overseeing future elections in their states, challenged or refused to accept the legitimacy of the 2020 results.

"The American people once again demonstrated their commitment to democratic elections in a hard-fought campaign and professionally run process," said Margareta Cederfelt, the OSCE Special Co-ordinator and leader of the short-term observers. "Unfortunately, we also noted that baseless allegations of fraud continued to have a serious result, in harassment of and threats against election officials. Certain systemic challenges, such as gerrymandering, enabling politicians to choose their voters, rather than the opposite, and the outsized influence of money on campaigning, must be addressed to ensure real equality of the vote."

"As a robust and well-established democracy, it is crucial that the United States continues to demonstrate its commitment to improving its electoral system by increasing the franchise, enhancing election security, and countering misinformation," said Pere Joan Pons, Head of the Delegation from the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly. "The challenges to democracy that the U.S. faces are common to many OSCE countries, and we must all work together to ensure that the citizens have trust in their democratic processes."

The OSCE PA worked closely with the team of the OSCE/ODIHR. The observation mission for these elections became the largest mission deployed by the Assembly to date.
